

WEEK OF PRAYER

This is the child protection policy and programme of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland and aims to create and promote a safe environment for children, young people and leaders. Everyone who volunteers with children, young people or vulnerable adults **must** go through the Taking Care process. If you fall into this category, you must (1) have an Access NI check and (2) attend Taking Care training once every three years. The next training evening at Fisherwick will be held on:

If you work with children, young people or vulnerable adults and have not attended Taking Care training within the past three years, please plan to attend. If you are unable to attend, training is available at other locations.

Access NI: If you are currently completing a form, IDs can be checked and photocopied after the Sunday morning service on **24th February**.
