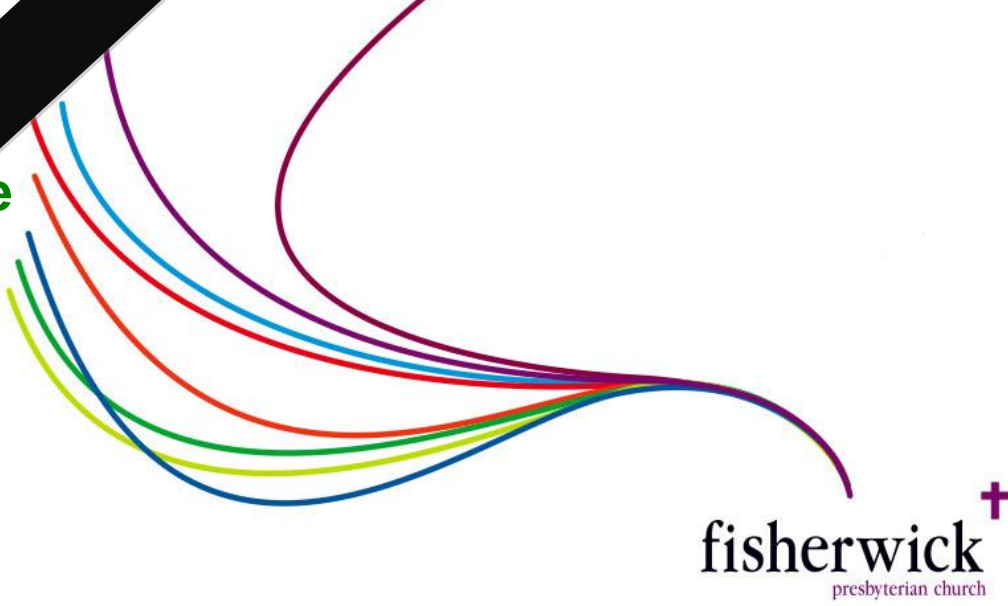

SPAIN

Derek and Jane French and the GBU Norte team are looking forward to the “*Chat & English*” evenings, which will start up again this Friday 19th October. Pray that many young people will come along to improve their English and hear the Gospel message. Pray too for the team as they prepare and organise these evenings.

GBU Norte will be presenting the ‘*Mark Experiment*’ twice this month, once for students and once for local churches. The Mark Experiment is described as follows: “*For the Mark Drama, you don't need props, costumes or professionals. But you can present every incident of Mark's Gospel vividly and powerfully to a group of invited guests, with a team of 15 actors from your church or Christian Union. It is an amazing experience for Christians, reminding them of the work of Jesus, and it's also great for anyone investigating the Christian faith.....The Mark Drama offers nothing less than a brilliant, vivid encounter with the person and work of the Lord Jesus Christ.*” So Mark’s Gospel will be presented in its entirety during 90 minutes by 15 Christian students.

MAJOR ROAD WORKS

On Sundays 28 October, 11, 18 and 25 November there will be major resurfacing work on the section of the Malone Road between Methody and Sans Souci Park. There will be no access up the Malone Road from University Road and residents only allowed down the Malone Road from the Stranmillis lights. On the first Sunday 28th access to parking in Lennoxvale, Sans Souci and the Malone Road above the church will be available via Stranmillis Road and Chlorine Gardens as works will be in the University Road to Chlorine Gardens section of the Malone Road. Roads Service and the contractors will supply information in advance to enable us to access the church and its car parks. If the weather is unsuitable, there may be postponements of these dates at short notice. BUT you will always be able to access the church.
